


Noh Discovering Tradition

Tradition is born in, and evolves from, the strength of ceremony. The deeper the roots of that tradition, the more wondrous and vital the resultant tree. While Noh enjoys 650 years of development, such a complex tradition can seem intimidating. This workshop invites you behind the curtain to discover the roots of this performing art.

The first part of this program is a hands-on workshop offering participants the opportunity to experience the dance, chant and musical instruments that are the essence of noh. Use your body and voice in new ways that will redefine your ideas of dance and music.

Part two of this program is a presentation by the Kita School of the classic noh Funabenkei. This will give the audience the chance to enjoy how these building blocks of noh interact with each other. Through this intensive one day noh experience, let the power of Japanese tradition reveal a world beyond the imagination of Western culture.


